NOTES FOR APPLICANTS

THE SCHOLARSHIPS

The OSI/FCO Chevening Scholarships, which are jointly funded by the Open Society Institute and the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office, are intended to provide opportunities for postgraduate study in selected fields in the United Kingdom for scholars and young professionals who demonstrate both academic excellence and the potential to become leaders, decision makers and opinion formers in their home countries. Applicants should have excellent academic qualifications, a clear and precise proposal describing what they wish to study, and a fluent command of the English language. The scholarships cover all university and college fees for a Master's degree course for up to one year, travel to and from the UK, and basic living expenses for a single person.

• OPTION ONE: One-year Scholarships to read for a Master's Degree at the University of Oxford Fifteen scholarships are available to scholars wishing to read for one of the following degrees (the courses are for either nine, ten or twelve months' duration):

Scholars wishing to apply for these scholarships should obtain information about the relevant degree and its requirements by consulting the University's Graduate Studies Prospectus, which is available online at http://www.admin.ox.ac.uk/gsp/. It is also available in printed form from the local OSI/Soros Foundation office.

All applicants for this option must <u>also</u> apply directly to the University for graduate admission. Application forms are available from the Oxford University website, which also gives details on how to apply. It is essential that all Master's graduate admission forms arrive at the Graduate Admissions Office of Oxford University by noon on January 12th at the very latest (with the required supporting materials); any applications received after this date will be disqualified from the Scholarship competition. It is recommended that applicants submit their applications in time to meet the earlier deadline of 24th November, where possible. It is important to note that the Scholarship will not be available for study leading to any other degree or diploma at the University of Oxford than those listed above.

• OPTION TWO: Twelve-month scholarships to read for an MA in Political Philosophy (The Idea of Toleration) at the University of York.

Scholars wishing to apply should obtain further information about the degree course either from the University of York website (http://www.york.ac.uk/depts/poli/gsp/polphil/tolmenu.htm) or from the local OSI/Soros Foundation office/Educational Advising Centre (applicants for this option do not need to apply directly to York).

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Applicants must be citizens of and resident in one of the following countries: Albania, Armenia, Belarus, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Croatia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Macedonia (Former Yugoslav Republic of), Moldova, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Ukraine or Uzbekistan.
- 2. Applicants should be planning to return to their home country at the end of the period of study.
- 3. All applicants must have completed at least four years of university study and have obtained, or expect to obtain, the appropriate degree(s), **not later than September 2007**.
- 4. Applicants must be over 23 and under 35 years of age on 1 October 2007.
- 5. Preference will be given to applicants who have not previously studied outside of their home country.
- 6. Applicants must demonstrate the potential to become leaders, decision makers, and opinion formers in their home country. This requirement will be treated as of considerable importance in the selection process, and applicants should be sure to complete Section 9 of the application form fully and appropriately.
- 7. Applicants will be required to have passed an English proficiency test (TOEFL or IELTS) before being offered a Scholarship. The minimum requirement for Option Two (York) is TOEFL 570 (230 in the computer-based test, 88-89 in the internet based test [iBT]) or IELTS 6.5. The minimum requirement for some of the courses available in Option One is TOEFL 600 (250 in the computer-based test or 100 in the Internet based test [iBT])) or IELTS 7.0; however most courses require the higher minimum requirement of IELTS 7.5, and some (courses such as those in the area of Oriental Studies) require IELTS 8.0. Please refer to the University of Oxford Graduate Studies Prospectus for further details; some departments only accept the IELTS.
- 8. Applicants applying for the 9 or 3-month Research Scholarships may not apply for the Oxford or York Master's Scholarships.
- 9. Employee's relatives (or former employees who have left employment less than 2 years before) of FCO (including FCO Posts), the British Council, the Educational Advising Centers or other OSI-NSP representations in the region, the participating Universities will not be eligible to apply for these awards.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE FOR ALL SCHOLARSHIPS

Application form

Applicants for all the above-mentioned scholarships should complete the enclosed Scholarship application form and return **two copies** of it to the local OSI/Soros Foundation Office or Education Advising Center, along with the required supporting materials listed below by November 24th, 2006.

Those applying for Option One must also ensure that they submit the Oxford University Graduate Admissions form (along with all the required supporting materials) in time for the deadline of noon on 12th January, 2007. Applications that arrive **after** this date will be rejected for the scholarship.
